Launch of the Hudson Valley Community College Honors College

Honors College students demonstrate intellectual curiosity, ambition, integrity, and global citizenship.

One of the Hudson Valley Community College Foundation's core funding priorities is the Honors College, a robust learning experience that offers students specially-designated honors courses, professional development experiences, research opportunities, internships and service projects. This baccalaureate preparatory program focuses on small student-to-advisor ratios to support students directly and offers them seamless transfer to a four-year institution to further pursue their academic goals. Many Honors College students are first-generation college students, and the opportunities provided by the program can be life-changing.

The Hudson Valley Community College Foundation recognized MVP Health Care's nowretired Vice President of Community Engagement Ellen Sax with the 2023 Outstanding Philanthropist Award at the annual Leadership Donors Reception on September 7, 2023. Hudson Valley Community College Foundation Annual Gala 2023

The Hudson Valley Community College Foundation hosted its annual Gala on Friday, Oct. 20, 2023 at the Franklin Plaza ballroom in Troy. Pradip Singh and Hui Peng Koh of GlobalFoundries (GF); Alexander "Sandy" Keeler of Keeler Motor Car; and the T & L Longe Charitable Foundation were honored with the Foundation Leadership Award in recognition of their service and dedication to the college and greater community. Proceeds from the event supported the creation of the college's new workforce training center, the Applied Technology Education Center (ATEC), which will be built on campus in Troy. ATEC will allow the college to address the urgent need for skilled, trained technicians in applied technologies and skilled trades, areas of increasing demand across the state and nation. In addition to the Gala proceeds, each of the organizations honored donated \$1 million to the creation of ATEC.



Applied Technology Education Center

The Foundation's priority capital project to upgrade existing programming space and create the new Applied Technology Education Center (ATEC) to support applied technology and skilled trades training was approved for funding in the New York State FY25 budget in Spring 2024. The college anticipates breaking ground on ATEC in 2025.





HVCC North Welcomes Students

Located in Malta, NY, HVCC North is an extension center of Hudson Valley Community College and offers students access to educational opportunities in the fast-growing fields of healthcare, STEM and skilled trades. It provides a more convenient location for students from Saratoga County and throughout the North Country to earn a degree or certificate from the college with minimal requirements on campus in Troy. New York State and Middle States Commission on Higher Education are considering the college's request to designate HVCC North as an official branch campus, which would further expand offerings for these students.





Recognizing Our Scholars: Annual Scholarship Celebration – April 26, 2024

The annual Hudson Valley Community College Foundation Scholarship Celebration was held on Friday, April 26, 2024. The ceremony formally recognized students who were awarded scholarships by the Foundation during the 2023-24 academic year, during which time the Foundation provided scholarships and awards totaling more than \$560,000 to more than 360 students.

ALUMNI/DONOR SPOTLIGHT: KAREN CAMPBELL '83

"As a graduating high school senior, I really didn't know what I wanted to pursue for a major or a career, but I was good at math and science. My father, a civil engineer, encouraged me to start by studying engineering until I figured out what I wanted to do.

As the oldest of seven children, I was very fiscally responsible, and it made sense to figure out whether engineering was for me before I took on the higher tuition of a four-year university, so I started at Hudson Valley. In my first year, I took courses in physics, chemistry, calculus, and electronics, but a mechanics course taught by Professor Gorham in the spring of my second year caught my interest and inspired me to pursue mechanical engineering as my major.

I got a great education in the Engineering Science program at Hudson Valley. The small class sizes and hands-on lab work were really conducive to effective learning, and a real community grew among the group of Engineering Science students going through the program together. I'm especially grateful for the bonds formed with three other young women who went through the program with me. It's been more than 40 years, and we're still connected to this day.

Hudson Valley gave me the option to transfer to a variety of four-year engineering schools, and I ultimately earned my bachelor's degree from RPI. The affordability of Hudson Valley, coupled with the scholarships and loans I received at RPI, allowed me to fund my education on my own, which was hugely helpful to me and my family. I know that the generosity of donors contributed to the affordability and excellence of education I received, so now I'm paying it forward in gratitude for all the people who've helped me had along the way. Students are dealing with hard issues in today's world, with affordability of education and even with food insecurity. I hope my contributions can help set them up for success, like my Hudson Valley education did for me.

I think most of us hope to leave the world a better place than we found it, and as individuals, we can only do so much. But by contributing to a community – especially an educational community like Hudson Valley – we have the opportunity not just to change individual students' lives for the better, but to make the world better by supporting generations of students who will do amazing things."
